## Foundation remembers two dynamic alumni

This past year we lost two of the Foundation's longtime loyal supporters. Both alumni gave of their time and talents to the South High Foundation and will be greatly missed.

### James Bloom '45

It was the mid '90s when Gerry Cady called on a group of alumni, including Jim Bloom, to consider the idea of a golf tournament to raise funds for the Foundation. Jim offered to coordinate the tournament drawing on his experience organizing the Twin Cities Purchasing Association event. The first tournament was held at Brackett's Crossing Country Club in 1996. Along with a hard working golf committee, Jim continued to act as chair for the next 17 years, collecting prizes, keeping track of golfers and storing all the golf tournament equipment in his own garage. In 2011 the name was changed to "The Jim Bloom/South High Foundation Golf Tournament."



Jim was dedicated to the work of the Foundation. He served on committees, helped at the pancake breakfast and played an important role in the construction of the South High Field House in 2009.

A couple years ago Jim came up with the idea to offer his timeshare vacation spot in Florida as one of the prize drawings at the pancake breakfast. He sold tickets at the alumni luncheon and at the breakfast (as shown in the photo). He was always looking for a way to raise funds for the Foundation, he was a proud and generous Tiger.



### Vonda Dauphinais Gluck '53

The fall 2007 Foundation newsletter featured a photo of a beautiful young Native American girl presenting a gift of wild rice on behalf of the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwa to Governor Youngdahl. That young girl, Vonda Dauphinais, grew up on Leech Lake Reservation then moved with her family to Minneapolis at the age of eight. Her Native American name was Mah-Ge-Gabo, which means mischief maker.

Vonda had a challenging but rewarding life. She attended the U of M and other colleges and graduated in 1982, lived in Cuba and Chicago, worked in real estate, banking and advertising. She met her husband when she was a hat check girl.

Active in many different organizations, Vonda procured donations from the casinos to support the South High Foundation. She helped at the pancake breakfast and the spaghetti dinner (as shown in the photo at the silent auction). Vonda also volunteered doing clerical work in the Foundation office. Vonda, will be remembered for her true Tiger spirit.

# Wall of Honor 2014

**George Schell**, former South High English teacher, graduated in education from Wayne State College in Nebraska. After eight years of teaching in Casper WY, he received a grant to further his education at the U of M. He began teaching at South High in 1963. Schell taught english electives, grammar, writing and literature. He produced and directed drama productions for 20 years, including *I Remember Mama*, *Barefoot in the Park* and the first play at the new South High in 1970, *The Death and Life of Sneaky Fitch*.

Schell advised the school newspaper, *The Southerner*, receiving Advisor of the Year award. During the summers he taught newspaper/yearbook workshops. In 1988, the *Southerner* was the first Minneapolis high school newspaper to be produced on a computer, funded by the South High Foundation. Schell also served as faculty liaison to the Foundation Centennial Committee who helped plan centennial events. Through extensive research, interviews, and writing, he produced a 64 page illustrated book with a comprehensive history of South from 1892-92.

George Schell has kept in touch with many students from various classes throughout the years. "One of my favorite classes was 1969, the last class in the old South, before the building was demolished," said Schell. He states that a wonderful way to keep in touch with former students is to attend the annual pancake breakfast sponsored by the Foundation. "This is like attending a South High Homecoming event!"

**Walter Roers '61**, football player and Homecoming King at South, graduated from the U of M with a bachelor's degree in psychology. He spent two years in the US Navy Reserve and then the next 37 years working for he Minnesota Dept. of Employment/Economic Development, adjudicating disability claims. During that time he served as agency director, overseeing 160 employees and processing over 60,000 claims a year. During the last few years of his directorship, the agency was rated as number one in the nation by the Social Security Administration.

In 1998 Roers entered a literary contest and won, resulting in his first novel in 2000, *The Pact*, a story set in Minneapolis in 1948. He received excellent reviews from Publishers Weekly, the St. Paul Pioneer Press, on New York radio and featured in an article in Mpls./St. Paul

magazine. He was a finalist for a Minnesota Book Award. A second novel, *Pathos Rising*, is set in modern day Twin Cities. His third novel, *Tyger! Tyger!*, published in 2013, follows the lives of four teens as they struggle with dramatic events that shape the rest of their lives, set at South High School from 1958-61.

**Robert Gabrick '58**, received his bachelor's degree at the University of Minnesota, a graduate degree in American Studies at Macalester College and continued his post graduate studies at a number of different colleges. Gabrick has been a teacher at River Falls High School, White Bear Lake, the U of M and presently at Padua Academy, in Delaware. He has been an educational and evaluation/assessment consultant. He currently serves as contributing editor of *America in World War II* magazine and is an archival consultant.

Gabrick has authored and co-authored many books but is known by many South High alumni for his popular book, *Khakis and Crinolines*, a pictorial history of the old South High School and surrounding schools. Over 700 copies of the book have been sold with a generous portion donated to the South High Foundation.

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## South Student Receives Perfect ACT Score

On South Senior William Ibele's third time taking the ACT, he accomplished something that only .01% of ACT test takers achieve. Ibele, a prospective drama major, earned the highest possible score on the ACT: 36. According to the the ACT website, the ACT is a "national college admission examination."

According to Ibele, he originally scored about a 29. He believes that this score may have been attributed to his dislike of standardized testing. With each test his score improved until he reached the ultimate score regardless of the fact that Ibele did not study for none of the tests. According to an interview with CBS, he was "surprised" when he found out he got a 36. Ibele attributes his final score as a combination of "luck" and being "good at testing."

Ibele appeared on WCCO TV on January 22nd and was also showcased on the Minneapolis Public Schools homepage. Since Ibele did not study for the ACT he advises future ACT test takers to, "pay attention in school."

Oulette-Howitz also received the Tamar Kaplan Student of the Year Award.
